Low political invovlement



Comparison of Key US Cases

	Chicago	New York City	Vallejo, CA
PB Funds	Discretionary Funds- ~\$1million minimum per Ward	Capital Discretionary Funds Min. \$1million per district	Funds from Sales Tax – approx. \$3.4million
Total population	~60,000 residents per ward, 4 wards	~160,000 residents per district, 8 districts	~ 116,000 residents
Peak Participation, to date	~2,000 (49 th Ward), figures for multi-ward process N/A	14, 000 (PBNYC Year 2, 8 districts)	4,000+

Budget Delegate Selection	Self Selection			
Requirements to Vote	Residents, ages 16+ PB voting includes non-citizens and others who cannot vote in political elections			
Voting	Voting occurs over 1 week, in many locations and times. No online voting.			
Sample Winners	Public murals, community gardens	Repairs to school bathrooms, security and traffic cameras, technology upgrades in	Street paving, small business grants, park improvements


