During November, Rights of Children and Young People Month, Cascais took part in a number of initiatives taking place all over the world, seeking to spark discussion about the challenges and opportunities involved in ensuring the Rights of Children and Young People in Cascais, which in 2020 focused on the Right to Participation. A number of children and young people from Cascais took part in the discussion, reflecting on and sharing their views and suggestions.

To make Cascais the ideal place to live as a child and as a young person, the town council, in partnership with the UNICEF Committee, has developed projects focusing on a global and integrated vision of the rights of children, thereby demonstrating a political commitment towards the development of local policy measures that are consistent with both the Convention on the Rights of the Child and the principles of the programme itself in respect of the following specific, transversal and interconnected areas: empowerment; governance, participation and communication; family, health and education; culture, sport, leisure and recreation; safety, mobility and accessibility; and the environment, energy and sustainability.

Therefore, it is important that public and private institutions respect and defend the rights of children and young people, encourage them to express their opinions freely, respect them and actively involve them in the decisions that affect their lives.
